



COVID – 19 Policies and Procedures

The magic of *Broadway Belts for PFF!* returns to the Edison Ballroom on Monday, March 7th and the health and safety of our attendees and staff is our top priority. To ensure a safe environment for both our guests and performers:

- We will strictly adhere to all federal and local health department guidelines, including those set forth by the CDC.
- Masks will be required while not eating or drinking.
- All event attendees are required by both the Edison Ballroom and the State of New York to show proof of full vaccination. *If you are unable to provide proof of vaccination for any reason, you will be denied entry to the event. A negative COVID test will not be accepted in place of proof of vaccination.*

We ask that you do not attend *Broadway Belts for PFF!* if any of the following is true for you or anyone in your party:

- Within 14 days before attending the event you have tested positive, or been exposed to someone who has tested positive for, COVID-19.
- Within 14 days prior to attending the event, you have travelled to any international territory identified by federal or applicable state or local governments as being subject to travel or quarantine advisories due to COVID-19.
- Within 48 hours prior to attending the event, you have experienced symptoms of COVID-19 (e.g., a fever of 100.4F or higher, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, chills, repeated shaking muscle pain/achiness, headache, sore throat, loss of taste or smell, nasal congestion, runny nose, vomiting, diarrhea, fatigue or any other symptoms associated with COVID-19 identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention).

By attending *Broadway Belts for PFF!*, you acknowledge that you are aware of the contagious nature of COVID-19 and voluntarily assume the risk that you and anyone in your party may be exposed to or infected with COVID-19 by attending *Broadway Belts for PFF!* You voluntarily agree to assume all of the foregoing risks, release the Pulmonary Fibrosis Foundation from liability, and accept sole responsibility for all risks, both known and unknown, related to COVID-19, including all illnesses, injuries, damages, or death arising there from.

We are continually monitoring conditions with regard to COVID-19 and will update our website with our event guidelines accordingly.
