This experience compelled her to establish a pulmonary fibrosis support group and the only free interstitial lung disease clinic in the world. Dot is now a volunteer PFF Ambassador who encourages other patients to consider transplantation and take advantage of available treatments.



DR. JOSEPH LASKY is the Director of the Interstitial Lung Disease Program and Section Chief of Pulmonary/Critical Care at Tulane University in New Orleans, Louisiana. He also serves as the Chair of the Research Review Committee for the PFF. Understanding the pathogenesis of pulmonary fibrosis has been the focus of his research career. Dr. Lasky's research has bridged from mechanistic studies in cell culture and animal models to the design and implementation of human trials. He has been involved in clinical trials as site-investigator, steering committee member, data safety monitoring board member and Chair, and co-principal investigator on an investigator-initiated trial.



DR. ANOOP NAMBIAR is an Associate Professor of Medicine and founding director of the Center for Interstitial Lung Disease at the University of Texas Health San Antonio. Dr. Nambiar's clinical and research efforts include: the first dedicated ILD/IPF clinic at UT Health San Antonio in 2011; development of a fortnightly multidisciplinary ILD/IPF conference in 2014; past and present research program with involvement in a number of multicenter investigator-initiated and industry-sponsored clinical trials; and community outreach.



EDITH PEREZ, MD is an internationally recognized translational researcher and cancer specialist, Professor of Medicine at Mayo Clinic, and Director of the Mayo Clinic Breast Cancer Translational Genomics Program. Her career experiences include leadership in academic and biopharmaceutical environments, with an added focus on philanthropic endeavors. Dr. Perez is the co-developer of the 26.2 National Marathon to Finish Breast Cancer (breastcancermarathon. com), with goals to raise funds for under-served women and genomics/immunologic translational cancer research. Dr. Perez will provide a unique perspective on the role of genetic and genomic biomarkers to accelerate personalized therapies in breast cancer and its relevance to our pulmonary fibrosis community.



BRAY PATRICK-LAKE, MFS is the Director of Strategic Partnerships at Evidation Health. She develops collaborations to support the design and implementation of participant-centered studies, and serves on the All of Us National Advisory Panel, the Digital Medicine Society Scientific Leadership Board, and the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine (NASEM) Health Science Policy Board. Previously, Bray led engagement for the Duke Clinical Research Institute Project Baseline Study Coordinating Center and served as co-chair on the Advisory Committee to the NIH Director that authored the Precision Medicine Initiative's Cohort Program. Bray holds a BS degree from the University of Georgia, and an MFS degree from National University.


